Joint General Election

On Tuesday, November 8, 2016, registered voters will be able to cast their election day ballots at ANY of the McLennan County vote centers. You can find a list of the vote centers and other voter information on the election page of our City of Robinson website, <http://www.robinsontexas.org/174/Election-and-Voter-Information>. The Robinson Community Center will serve as a voting center location again this year and is located at 106 W. Lyndale, right behind Rocket Café in the Rocket Row Shopping Center. ID Required for Texas Voters

You must present one of the following forms of photo ID when voting in person:

- Texas driver license issued by the Texas DPS
- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- Texas license to carry a handgun issued by DPS
- United States military identification card with your photograph
- United States citizenship certificate containing your photograph
- United States passport

Unable to obtain one of these ID's? Fill out a declaration at the polls explaining why and bring one of the following supporting documents:

- Valid Voter registration certificate
- Certified birth certificate (must be an original)
- Copy of or original current utility bill
- Copy of or original bank statement
- Copy of or original government check
- Copy of or original paycheck
- Copy of or original government document with your name and an address (original required if it contains a photograph)

*With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, ID must be current or have expired no more than 4 years before being presented for voter qualification at the polling place. Exemptions: Voters with a disability may apply with the county registrar for an exemption. Voters with a religious objection to being photographed or voters who do not have an ID due to certain natural disasters may apply for a temporary exemption to showing ID at the polls. Food for Families



Food for Families is an annual project for the Boy Scouts of America, H-E-B Grocery Company, Texas Army National Guard and KWTX-TV. Together with food pantries all across Central Texas, this one-day food drive collects non-perishable food and stocks the shelves of area food banks and pantries beyond the holiday season.

On the Friday before Thanksgiving, volunteers from the Boy Scouts, H-E-B Grocery Company, Texas Army National Guard and other community organizations, collect food in 9 counties. Food for Families is the largest one-day food drive in Texas.

All donated food serves the people in the county in which it was collected. Central Texans have generously donated food and money totaling more than one million pounds each year for the past eight years. In 2015 alone, over 1.8 million pounds of food was collected. In McLennan County alone in 2015, over 514,000 pounds of food was collected.

The City of Robinson will be collecting food donations from November 1st through November 17th to turn in on Friday, November 18th during the Food for Families food drive. You are invited to join the city in this collection by dropping off non-perishable food products to City Hall, Monday through Friday from Nov. 1st to Nov. 17th. Products needed most: canned meats, tuna, chili, stew, chicken, canned vegetables, cereals, baby food, peanut butter, dry beans, rice, flour, sugar, corn meal, pastas and sauces.
