Become a Member of a Board or Commission

City Council is seeking individuals to fill vacancies on the city's board and commissions, see details below.

Zoning Board of Adjustment

- Five-member board that requires five regular members and four alternate members that serve two-year terms. Members must be Robinson citizens and are appointed by City Council.
- Meetings are held on the fourth Tuesday of the month, must be at least once a year, and meetings are usually 1 hour long.
- Hears and decides an appeal that alleges error in an order, requirement, decision, or determination made by an administrative official regarding the zoning ordinance.
- Hears and decides special exceptions to the terms of the zoning ordinance.
- Authorizes, in specific cases, a variance from the terms of the zoning ordinance if the variance is not contrary to the public interest and, due to special conditions, a literal enforcement of the zoning ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship, so the spirit of the zoning ordinance is observed and substantial justice is done.

Building Standards Commission

- Five-member board that requires five regular members and four alternate members that serve two-year terms. Members must be Robinson citizens and are appointed by City Council.
- Meetings are held on the second Tuesday of the month, must be at least once a year, and meetings are usually 1 hour long.
- Members should have experience or expertise in the building trade.
- The Building Standards Commission has the authority to hear and determine cases concerning alleged violations of City ordinances related to building codes, including the minimum housing code; conditions covered by accumulation of matter that creates unsanitary and unhealthy conditions; and serves as an advisory board to the city council to review and recommend ordinances and associated amendments.

Planning & Zoning Commission

- Five-member board that requires five regular members. Members must be Robinson citizens and are appointed by City Council.
- Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of the month, must meet at least quarterly, and report to The Council quarterly. Meetings are usually 1 hour long.
- Members should have experience or expertise in planning, development, engineering, and building trades.
- The Planning and Zoning Commission must review and make a recommendation on the following development review regulations, procedures, and applications: Zoning Ordinance Amendments; Zoning District Map Amendments; Planned Unit Developments; Special Permits; and Other matters required by the ordinances of the City or state law.
